## **San Diego Master Chorale, San Diego Baroque Perform 2 French-Inspired Concerts in November**

**SAN DIEGO – November 1, 2018** – In October, it was the rarely-performed Brahms Requiem with two pianos. This month, San Diego Master Chorale (SDMC) teams up with acclaimed chamber soloists San Diego Baroque for a musical excursion to France, performing vocal works by Marc-Antoine Charpentier (1643-1704), and instrumental works inspired by his music.

Both performances of “Charpentier and the French Baroque,” November 9 and 10, will center on small-style consort singing, creating an intimate setting. Selections will include Charpentier’s “Le Reniement de Sainte Pierre” (the Denial of St. Peter) and his “Miserere.”
